Future Planning

The RDA is working on a range of recovery and development projects across the Virgin Islands. The section below details projects currently in planning that have not been fully approved with a signed Statement of Requirement (SoR) from the Government.

Once a project has a signed Statement of Requirement (SoR), the project will move to Annex I of this report. Once a project is complete, a summary of the project can be found in Annex II.

Current future projects in planning include:

1.1.1. Renewable Energy

The proposal for the renewable energy programme has been forwarded to the Premier's Office for review. This proposal was based on recommendations from the Working Group¹ including representatives of BVI Electricity Corporation, Government and the Climate Change Trust Fund. The Working Group and the RDA await further direction from the Premier's Office in moving forward with this programme, progressing delivery of this programme.

1.1.2. Priority Government Programmes

The RDA is working with the Deputy Governor's Office on a rapid assessment of priority Government buildings, to map public services and consolidate numbers of staff for each Department. This work is being done to support prioritisation of public buildings for repair which will guide RDA's planning. Ten (10) buildings were assessed and submitted to the DG, the RDA is awaiting requests for further assistance with additional assessments.

The RDA planning team has been also working with the Deputy Governor and the Ministry of Finance's Projects Unit to plan immediate repairs to the Central Administration Complex (CAC) however this project has been formally allocated to the Ministry of Transportation Works and Utilities by the Premier. The RDA's role going forward is solely to provide technical advice as requested by the ministry.





West End Ferry Terminal

Status: Planning

Outcome, Seaports: "Rehabilitated and expanded port facilities and services throughout the Territory with modernized and resilient facilities relevant to passengers and cargo"

Overview

The West End Ferry Terminal has been an important mode for travellers moving between the British Virgin Islands and the US Virgin Islands, as well as the sole hub for domestic travel between Jost Van Dyke and Tortola. This is a major access hub to the Virgin Islands with 170,000 passengers routing through this terminal in 2016. The destruction of the facility during hurricanes Irma and Maria has presented challenges to travellers wishing to travel to the BVI.

The West End Ferry Terminal project aims to revitalize the terminal and enhance it to be a major port hub within the Virgin Islands.

Status

The West End Ferry Terminal is still in the early planning phases. The Statement of Requirement was signed by the Premier's Office on 20 May 2019. A request for proposals for geotechnical engineering services has been issued in June and closed. There were a successful number of submissions and the technical evaluation is underway. The project is also currently awaiting confirmation of funding before moving forward with the more detailed planning process. The Planning Business Case for this project has been finalised and shared with stakeholders including the Premier's Office.





Virgin Gorda Baths

Outcome 1: Improved tourism product that is aesthetically appealing, easily accessible and provides an enhanced experience to our visitors and a catalyst for economic recovery.

Overview

The Baths at Virgin Gorda is an important tourist destination that suffered damage to ticket booth, bathroom and bar shaded area. While originally the scope of works included minor repairs, the needs have since expanded to a wider project.

Activity 1: Design

Status: Completed

The contractor, Systems Engineering, has submitted required designs for the beach and rest stop shades. As such, the design activity of this project has been completed.

Activity 2: Construction

Status: Procurement

Budget: \$187,978

Site contractors began working on the site on 1 August.

Safety barriers have been erected to separate construction and tourist activities. There have been some delays with procurement and shipping from ports in Florida due to Hurricane Dorian.

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Removal of Derelict Boats

Outcome 1: Improved tourism product that is aesthetically appealing, easily accessible and provides an enhanced experience to our visitors and a catalyst for economic recovery

Overview

The passing of hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017 left a significant number of marine vessels stranded along the coastlines and bays of the Virgin Islands. The bulk of these vessels have been removed by the owners and their insurance providers. However approximately 280 derelict vessels remain that need to be removed from their land or sea location and then disposed of.

This is a large, complex project that requires detailed planning to minimize the effect on the environment and maintain value for money.

Activity 1: Staging Site Preparation

Status: Procurement

The technical and financial evaluations are complete. The team is currently awaiting funding confirmation before moving forward with contracting.

Activity 2: Removal

Status: Procurement

The technical and financial evaluations are complete. The team is currently awaiting funding confirmation before moving forward with contracting.

Activity 3: Processing

Status: Procurement

The technical and financial evaluations are complete. The team is currently awaiting funding confirmation before moving forward with contracting.



Outcome N5: Immediate improvement to national infrastructure to prepare for recovery

Overview

The reinstatement of the navigational system is crucial to the navigation of BVI waters to ensure safe passage of vessels and ensure that the BVI is tourist ready. The Territory's sea markers are managed by the BVI Ports Authority (BVIPA), with input from Virgin Islands Shipping Registry (VISR) on placement.

The majority of the markers have been reinstated by BVIPA, however there are some markers still outstanding.

Status

The final location list from the BVIPA has been sent to the contractor. A cost variation has been agreed upon after changes. The contractor has ordered markers, which are scheduled to arrive at the end of September.





Elmore Stoutt High School

Outcome 2A: Restored educational and recreational facilities that provide a safe and secure environment for learning and recreational activities

Overview

The RDA is overseeing construction and renovation of classrooms for Elmore Stoutt High School in consultation with the Ministry and landowners. The outcome of the project is to improve the present conditions at the school.

Activity 1: Temporary Classrooms

Status: Procurement

The temporary modular units arrived to Tortola on 18 August and onsite on 23 August. The units were installed on the concrete slab and there are outstanding works for air conditioning and electrical fitouts, which are due to be completed on 31 Aug.

Activity 2: CTL Improvements

Status: Operations

The works and improvements on the CTL building are going well, with work approximately 75% complete. Final activities include electrical works and AC installation. There were reports of leaks from the roof which are being reviewed for repair.

Overview

The Virgin Gorda basketball sports complex was damaged by the 2017 hurricanes and has been in a state of disrepair and thus has been unusable since then. The facility is used by the residents of Virgin Gorda for sporting events and recreation. The facility is currently unsuitable for use, denying the residents this opportunity.

Activity 1: Structure

Status: Operations

Budget: \$700,000

Works are progressing as scheduled. Remedial works to rusted steel sections of the structure are underway.

Remedial work to the steel frame structure is currently underway. There is anticipation of a variation to the wall panels order and the proposed roof panels were too damaged for reuse.

Prospective donors are expressing interest in contributing to this project, either for the existing toilets to be repaired, new installation in the basketball court or to assist with improving parking facilities.

Activity 2: Flooring

Status: Planning

The specifications of the sports flooring have been confirmed and will be delivered to the contractor to facilitate the supply and installation process.

Overview


The AO Shirley athletics grounds is a priority project to renovate the grounds to meet international accreditation standards as a Level 2 ground, so that BVI can host upcoming national events later this year and future international events. This requires preparation of the grounds prior to the installation of the new track by the specialist company Mondo, repairs to make the perimeter secure to boost income-generation from events, installation of bathroom facilities, installation of lights to allow events after dark, repair to the spectator stand (ideally with shade), and renovation of the clubhouse pavilion to provide meetings, events and changing facilities.

Activity 1: Track

Status: Completed

Budget: \$139,150

The track laying and painting has been completed, and the track activity is therefore finished. We have received feedback from BVIOC and athletes that they are happy with the quality of the track and how it was installed.





Activity 2: Bathroom

Status: Operations

Budget: \$170,594

The bathroom installation has been completed including plumbing and electricity connections, and minor adjustments are being made prior to full completion of this activity.

Activity 3: Wall and Gates

Status: Operations

Budget: \$261,448

Two walls received concrete on 23 August and a block way adjacent to the highway has been demolished with plans to re-instate. Procurement of the plastic panels will be necessary for completion of this activity. Following some delays with the initial contractor, procurement of these panels is now scheduled to be secured in September.



Activity 4: Other Activities

Status: Operations

A request for proposals was sent out on 13 August for track side fencing and closed on 26 August. An evaluation was completed, and the project was awarded to No Limit Construction, with a completion timeline of three weeks.

Outcome 2B: Safe housing options to the most vulnerable households/individuals to restore dignity, privacy and a decent quality of life and support to ministry to develop public assistance and cross-government social protection services

Overview

Several persons and families remain displaced and are living in temporary housing or tents. Many of these are living without running water, electricity or sanitation.

The temporary housing project involves building temporary homes (domes) for four of the most vulnerable households and installing utilities (plumbing, sanitation, drainage and electricity) in these. Additionally, the project will provide 11 other households with utilities.



Activity 1: MEP and Installation

Status: Procurement Underway

A tender for the installation of the temporary homes was published on 31 May and closed on 12 July. A technical evaluation committee met twice, on 19 July and 15 August, with the technical evaluation completed 16 August. A decision will be issued in recommendation of a contractor and negotiations will be undertaken into the beginning of September.

Activity 2: Dome Purchase

Status: Procurement Underway

A purchase order for four domes was issued to InterShelter Inc. in April 2019. The domes are currently being held at the port until MEP is completed for installation.

Outcome 2B: Safe housing options to the most vulnerable households/individuals to restore dignity, privacy and a decent quality of life and support to ministry to develop public assistance and cross-government social protection services

Overview

With so much of the housing stock damaged or destroyed by the hurricanes, the Ministry of Health and Social Development launched the Housing Recovery Programme to provide grants, loans and funding to help vulnerable families rebuild their houses.

The RDA is working with the Ministry to implement aspects of the programme.

Status

An invitation to tender was published on 18 July. Due to bidders' requests for clarification on bill of quantities and scope of works, the procurement period has been extended to 12 September for repairs to one home on Virgin Gorda.

The RDA is working with the Ministry and is in the planning stages of the broader repair of damaged homes programme. The statement of requirement (SoR) was signed on 26 August. Assessments and interviews will now be conducted to create a more detailed project plan.

Outcome 3C: Immediate improvement to priority government infrastructure and systems to improve services key to easing ability of doing business and prepare for recovery

Overview

The two Virgin Gorda Admin buildings, the Flax building and the Vanterpool building, were badly affected by the 2017 hurricanes. The roof of the Flax building was destroyed, and this building is now unoccupied.

All services are now being provided in the Vanterpool building. There are leaks (allowing ingress of rainwater) and traces of mould/damp in the Vanterpool building, which is contributing to the sub-standard provision of public services and health risks for staff.

Activity 1: Cleaning

Status: Completed

Budget: \$12,780

The cleaning works have been completed, as well as tile removal and air conditioner/dehumidifier installation. Further works to install ceiling tiles were added to the initial scope to ensure adequate soundproofing. A close-out report for this activity was finalised in June, and included lessons learned on the importance of pre-start meetings and on-site presence at start of projects, and stakeholder communication regarding building access.

Activity 2: Wooden Structures

Status: On Hold

The RDA is currently working with stakeholders on the requirements of the wooden structures and what the original occupants of the Vanterpool building need.

Activity 3: Repairs

Status: Planning

Design Report 1 for the repairs to both the Vanterpool and Flax buildings was received in mid-March. A stakeholder meeting was held on 28 March at the Deputy Governor's Office, confirming the requirements needed for the repairs. This meeting will inform the Design Report 2, which is needed to move forward into procurement. A decision has been made to pursue the repair to these buildings within the broader CDB loan portfolio of projects.

Outcome 3B: Functioning law enforcement institutions and communication networks to restore a sense of safety and security and improved communications between agencies

Overview

Repairs and renovations of the Road Town Police Station were implemented through the Office of the Governor, with funding from the UK Government, and the police station is now fully functional. However, some minor repairs to improve the appearance and conditions for those working within it remain outstanding.

The RDA will take on the final repairs, including signage, fencing, painting and final office repairs, in partnership with the Deputy Governor's Office and the Royal Virgin Islands Police Force.

Status

The statement of requirement (SoR) was signed 21 August and the scope of works (SoW) completed on 30 August. The cost estimation is due to be completed in early September.

Outcome 3B: Functioning law enforcement institutions and communication networks to restore a sense of safety and security and improved communications between agencies

Overview

The purpose is to return the Virgin Gorda Police Barracks to a fully functional state with police able to deploy required numbers from Tortola. A key outcome will be for the police to be able to sleep personnel on Virgin Gorda to ensure a shift system can be effectively managed and to enable the pre-disposition of resources key to disaster preparedness ahead of the 2019 hurricane season.

Status

A final walkthrough took place on 31 July. Final minor changes were completed on 19 August, with a handover to the Ministry on 30 August. An opening ceremony is planned for early September.

A closeout report will be written for the project to evaluate the project's performance as well as inform future projects with identified lessons. Following this, a brief analysis of the project will appear in Annex II.

Outcome 3C: Immediate improvement to priority government infrastructure and systems to improve services key to easing ability of doing business and prepare for recovery

Overview

The repairs to the Jost Van Dyke administration building will re-establish a working space for the District Officer to coordinate public service delivery on the island, as well as space for police, customs and immigration services to become fully functional. This will re-establish a fully functioning border control point at the main jetty and re-establish a functional police base, including a cell. The full detailed scoping and procurement for this project have been completed and operations are ongoing.

Status

The project is now complete. All outstanding works were completed 22 August.

An opening ceremony is expected to occur during the month of September. A closeout report will be written for the project to evaluate the project's performance and inform future projects with identified lessons. Following this, a brief analysis of this project will appear in Annex II.


Summary Report


The RDA Project Number 146 covers the works to demolish destroyed structures at the Elmore Stoutt High School site in preparation for the rehabilitation of ESHS, in partnership with the Ministry of Education, Culture, Agriculture Fisheries, Sports & Youth Affairs.

Activity 146.01 was created to demolish and clear the remaining of what was called the "New Steel Frame Building" creating space for the installation of the temporary music classrooms and a storage area. The Department of Waste Management directed that metal scrap would be separated and transported to Pockwood Pond, with all other materials disposed at the incinerator.


The contract for demolition works was awarded to Autland Heavy Equipment Co. Ltd., with the contract being signed on 24 May 2019.
