Future Planning

The RDA is working on a range of recovery and development projects across the Virgin Islands. The section below details projects currently in planning that have not been fully approved with a signed Statement of Requirement (SoR) from the Government.

Once a project has a signed Statement of Requirement (SoR), the project will move to Annex I of this report. Once a project is complete, a summary of the project can be found in Annex II.

Current future projects in planning include:

1.1.1. Renewable Energy

The proposal for the renewable energy programme has been forwarded to the Premier's Office for review. This proposal was based on recommendations from the Working Group¹ including representatives of BVI Electricity Corporation, Government and the Climate Change Trust Fund. The Working Group and the RDA await further direction from the Premier's Office in moving forward with this programme, progressing delivery of this programme.

1.1.2. Priority Government Programmes

The RDA is working with the Deputy Governor's Office on a rapid assessment of priority Government buildings, to map public services and consolidate numbers of staff for each Department. This work is being done to support prioritisation of public buildings for repair which will guide RDA's planning.

¹ The Green Energy Working Group was initially formed by the BVI Electricity Corporation and includes representatives from BVIEC, Government, and the Climate Change Trust Fund.

The RDA planning team is also working with the Deputy Governor and the Ministry of Finance's Projects Unit to plan immediate repairs to the Central Administration Complex (CAC). The RDA has provided input to a Cabinet Paper regarding the progress on planning of the immediate repairs and the long-term refurbishment of the CAC. The RDA now awaits formal tasking by the Government and funding.

As noted in Table 9 above, in July, the RDA received additional commitments totalling \$1.09 million for the renewable energy programme, and towards recreational facilities on Anegada and Jost van Dyke. The RDA has also received multiple **expressions of interest** totalling \$265,000 in private contributions.

Participation by private sector and non-governmental organisations is critical to a shared, sustainable recovery and development process. This encompasses fundraising and partnerships as well as regular consultation and engagement with businesses, non-governmental organisations, and individuals in the community.

West End Ferry Terminal

Lead ministry: Premier's Office

Project: 091 Status: Planning

Start date: April 2019 Estimated end date: TBD

Outcome, Seaports: "Rehabilitated and expanded port facilities and services throughout the Territory with modernized and resilient facilities relevant to passengers and cargo"

Overview

The West End Ferry Terminal has been an important mode for travellers moving between the British Virgin Islands and the US Virgin Islands, as well as the sole hub for domestic travel between Jost Van Dyke and Tortola. This is a major access hub to the Virgin Islands with 170,000 passengers routing through this terminal in 2016. The destruction of the facility during hurricanes Irma and Maria has presented challenges to travellers wishing to travel to the BVI.

The West End Ferry Terminal project aims to revitalize the terminal and enhance it to be a major port hub within the Virgin Islands.

Status

The West End Ferry Terminal is still in the early planning phases. The Statement of Requirement was drafted and sent to the Premier's Office. The SoR was signed on 20 May and a presentation to the Premier provided feedback on the business case and design. A draft business case was submitted to the Premier's Office for feedback and comments, and the business case is expected to be finalised in August, incorporating these comments. The project is currently awaiting confirmation of funding before moving forward with the more detailed planning process.





Virgin Gorda Baths

Lead ministry: Natural Resources, Labour and Immigration

Project: 103 Status: Procurement

Start date: February 2019 Estimated end date: September 2019

Outcome 1: Improved tourism product that is aesthetically appealing, easily accessible and provides an enhanced experience to our visitors and a catalyst for economic recovery.

Overview

The Baths at Virgin Gorda is an important tourist destination that suffered damage to ticket booth, bathroom and bar shaded area. While originally the scope of works included minor repairs, the needs have since expanded to a wider project.

Activity 1: Design



The contractor, Systems Engineering, has submitted required designs for the beach and rest stop shades. As such, the design activity of this project has been completed.

Activity 2: Construction

Status: Procurement Budget: \$187,978

The contract for the construction activity was signed by Maynard Construction on 22 July. A site visit between the project managers and the contractor was held on 29 July. Maynard Construction is scheduled to begin work on-site on 1 August.



Removal of Derelict Boats

Lead ministry: Natural Resources, Labour and Immigration

Project: 133 Status: Procurement

Start date: October 2018 Estimated end date: March 2020

Outcome 1: Improved tourism product that is aesthetically appealing, easily accessible and provides an enhanced experience to our visitors and a catalyst for economic recovery

Overview

The passing of hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017 left a significant number of marine vessels stranded along the coastlines and bays of the Virgin Islands. The bulk of these vessels have been removed by the owners and their insurance providers. However approximately 280 derelict vessels remain that need to be removed from their land or sea location and then disposed of.

This is a large, complex project that requires detailed planning to minimize the effect on the environment and maintain value for money.

Activity 1: Staging Site Preparation

Status: Procurement

The invitation to tender was extended from 24 June to 8 July. An evaluation committee was convened, and the technical evaluation was complete on 24 July.

Activity 2: Removal

Status: Procurement

The invitation to tender was extended from 24 June to 8 July. An evaluation committee was convened, and the technical evaluation was completed on 24 July.

Activity 3: Processing

Status: Procurement

The invitation to tender was extended from 24 June to 8 July. An evaluation committee was convened, and the technical evaluation was completed on 24 July.

Activity 4: Disposal

Sea Markers Installation

Outcome N5: Immediate improvement to national infrastructure to prepare for recovery

Overview

The reinstatement of the navigational system is crucial to the navigation of BVI waters to ensure safe passage of vessels and ensure that the BVI is tourist ready. The Territory's sea markers are managed by the BVI Ports Authority (BVIPA), with input from Virgin Islands Shipping Registry (VISR) on placement.

The majority of the markers have been reinstated by BVIPA, however there are some markers still outstanding.

Status

The contract for sea marker installation was signed with Dollar Marine Consultants on 11 July. The contractor is currently awaiting the final list of coordinates for sea markers from the Shipping Registry to facilitate installation.





Elmore Stoutt High School

Lead ministry: Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries and Agriculture

Project: 147 Status: Procurement

Start date: November 2018 Estimated end date: September 2019

Outcome 2A: Restored educational and recreational facilities that provide a safe and secure environment for learning and recreational activities

Overview

The RDA is overseeing construction and renovation of classrooms for Elmore Stoutt High School in consultation with the Ministry and landowners. The outcome of the project is to improve the present conditions at the school.

Activity 1: Temporary Classrooms

Status: Procurement

The modular units for temporary classrooms are currently in production and are expected to arrive in the Territory in early August. A bidder's conference was held on 10 July for the procurement of the installation of the temporary classrooms. Tenders for infrastructure items such as chain link fencing, ramps, steps, and handrails were due on 22 July.

Activity 2: CTL Improvements

Status: Operations

CTL improvement works are progressing ahead of schedule with work on the acoustic ceiling, frame installation, door installation, and step repairs completed in July.







Virgin Gorda Sports Complex Repairs

Lead ministry: Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries and Agriculture

Project: 151 Status: Procurement

Start date: January 2019 Estimated end date: October 2019

Outcome 2A: Restored educational and recreational facilities that provide a safe and secure environment for learning and recreational activities

Overview

The Virgin Gorda basketball sports complex was damaged by the 2017 hurricanes and has been in a state of disrepair and thus has been unusable since then. The facility is used by the residents of Virgin Gorda for sporting events and recreation. The facility is currently unsuitable for use, denying the residents this opportunity.

Activity 1: Structure

Status: Operations Budget: \$700,000

Works on the structure commenced on-site on 8 July. Thus far, the panel scaffold has been erected, site fencing installed, and damaged roof panels as well as wall panels have been removed.

Currently remedial work to the steel frame structure is underway. There is anticipation of a variation to the wall panels order and the proposed roof panels were too damaged for reuse.

Prospective donors are expressing interest in contributing to this project, either for the existing toilets to be repaired, new installation in the basketball court or to assist with improving parking facilities.

Activity 2: Flooring

Status: Planning

A stakeholder meeting was held on 16 May. Following the meeting, the Recreational Trust is working with the RDA on proposed specifications of flooring before a call for tenders is released for the second time.


Overview

The AO Shirley athletics grounds is a priority project to renovate the grounds to meet international accreditation standards as a Level 2 ground, so that BVI can host upcoming national events later this year and future international events. This requires preparation of the grounds prior to the installation of the new track by the specialist company Mondo, repairs to make the perimeter secure to boost income-generation from events, installation of bathroom facilities, installation of lights to allow events after dark, repair to the spectator stand (ideally with shade), and renovation of the clubhouse pavilion to provide meetings, events and changing facilities.

Activity 1: Track

Status: Completed Budget: \$139,150

The track laying and painting has been completed, and the track activity is therefore finished. We have received feedback from BVIOC and athletes that they are happy with the quality of the track and how it was installed.





Activity 2: Bathroom

Status: Operations

Supply and installation of the bathrooms is in process. The containers arrived in the BVI on 28 July and are currently being cleared. The supplier ContekPro arrived on 30 July. Installation of the bathrooms is expected to be completed in early August.

Activity 3: Wall and Gates

Status: Operations Budget: \$261,448

The wall and gates construction began on 1 June with the contractor Systems Engineering. Wall construction, including concrete pouring and grouting of rebars is ongoing. With upcoming procurement of the necessary plastic materials for completion, this activity is scheduled to be completed by the end of the year.





Activity 4: Other Activities

Status: Operations

Funding for grandstands and lighting has been confirmed on 28 June and will be tendered in the near future. The contract for bathroom drainage and groundworks was signed with No Limit Construction. The works began in June and are progressing on time.

Virgin Gorda Admin Building Repair

Outcome 3C: Immediate improvement to priority government infrastructure and systems to improve services key to easing ability of doing business and prepare for recovery

Overview

The two Virgin Gorda Admin buildings, the Flax building and the Vanterpool building, were badly affected by the 2017 hurricanes. The roof of the Flax building was destroyed, and this building is now unoccupied.

All services are now being provided in the Vanterpool building. There are leaks (allowing ingress of rainwater) and traces of mould/damp in the Vanterpool building, which is contributing to the sub-standard provision of public services and health risks for staff.

Activity 1: Cleaning

Status: Completed Budget: \$12,780

The cleaning works have been completed, as well as tile removal and air conditioner/dehumidifier installation. Further works to install ceiling tiles were added to the initial scope to ensure adequate soundproofing. A close-out report for this activity was finalised in June, and included lessons learned on the importance of pre-start meetings and on-site presence at start of projects, and stakeholder communication regarding building access.

Activity 2: Wooden Structures

Status: On Hold

The RDA is currently working with stakeholders on the requirements of the wooden structures and what the original occupants of the Vanterpool building need.

Activity 3: Repairs

Status: Planning

Design Report 1 for the repairs to both the Flax and Vanterpool buildings was received in mid-March. A stakeholder meeting was held on 28 March at the Deputy Governor's Office, confirming the requirements needed for the repairs. This meeting will inform the Design Report 2, which is needed to move forward into procurement.





Virgin Gorda Police Barracks Repair

Outcome 3B: Functioning law enforcement institutions and communication networks to restore a sense of safety and security and improved communications between agencies

Overview

The purpose is to return the Virgin Gorda Police Barracks to a fully functional state with police able to deploy required numbers from Tortola. A key outcome will be for the police to be able to sleep personnel on Virgin Gorda to ensure a shift system can be effectively managed and to enable the pre-disposition of resources key to disaster preparedness ahead of the 2019 hurricane season.

Status

On 11 July the container with the remaining lights and shutters arrived and items were secured on site for the remaining works.

A final walkthrough occurred at the end of July to note any final changes to be made and cleaning that needs to be done. An opening ceremony is being planned for late August/early September.





Jost Van Dyke Admin Building Repair

Project: 183 Status: Operations

Outcome 3C: Immediate improvement to priority government infrastructure and systems to improve services key to easing ability of doing business and prepare for recovery

Overview

The repairs to the Jost Van Dyke administration building will re-establish a working space for the District Officer to coordinate public service delivery on the island, as well as space for police, customs and immigration services to become fully functional. This will reestablish a fully functioning border control point at the main jetty and re-establish a functional police base, including a cell. The full detailed scoping and procurement for this project have been completed and operations are ongoing.

Status

Front metalworks and doors were installed in the beginning of the month. All works have been completed except for rear railings, due to material availability.

Handover is expected to occur during the month of August.



Summary Report


The RDA Project Number 146 covers the works to demolish destroyed structures at the Elmore Stoutt High School site in preparation for the rehabilitation of ESHS, in partnership with the Ministry of Education, Culture, Agriculture Fisheries, Sports & Youth Affairs.

Activity 146.01 was created to demolish and clear the remaining of what was called the "New Steel Frame Building" creating space for the installation of the temporary music classrooms and a storage area. The Department of Waste Management directed that metal scrap would be separated and transported to Pockwood Pond, with all other materials disposed at the incinerator.


Tons of debris removed from ESHS




The contract for demolition works was awarded to Autland Heavy Equipment Co. Ltd., with the contract being signed on 24 May 2019.
