Future Planning

The RDA is working on a range of recovery and development projects across the Virgin Islands. The section below details projects currently in planning that have not been fully approved with a signed Statement of Requirement (SoR) from the Government.

Once a project has a signed Statement of Requirement (SoR), the project will move to Annex I. Current future projects in planning include:

1.1.1. Renewable Energy

The proposal for the renewable energy programme has been forwarded to the Premier's Office for review. This proposal was based on recommendations from the Working Group¹ including representatives of BVI Electricity Corporation, Government and the Climate Change Trust Fund. The Working Group and the RDA await further direction from the Premier's Office in moving forward with this programme, progressing delivery of this programme.

1.1.2. Priority Government Programmes

The RDA is working with the Deputy Governor's Office on a rapid assessment of priority Government buildings, to map public services and consolidate numbers of staff for each Department. This work is being done to support prioritisation of public buildings for repair which will guide RDA's planning.

The RDA planning team is also working with the Deputy Governor and the Ministry of Finance's Projects Unit to plan immediate repairs to the Central Administration Complex (CAC). The RDA has provided input to a Cabinet Paper regarding the progress on planning of the immediate repairs and the long-term refurbishment of the CAC. The RDA now awaits formal tasking by the Government and funding.

Over the past month, there have been 2 new confirmed contributions. One is the final portion of funding from Unite BVI with the completion of the Special Debris Clearance project. The other an anonymous donation to the West End Ferry Terminal project through in-kind contributions.

In addition to the list above, the RDA has received commitments for an additional \$4 million in private contributions. This amount differs from last month's value of \$6.2 million because some contributions have moved into negotiations and confirmed contributions.

The RDA is also currently in negotiations for an additional \$12.5 million.

Possible funding committed and in negotiation are linked to multiple projects and programmes, including the West End Ferry Terminal, clearing of derelict boats, and the renewable energy programme.

Participation by private sector and non-governmental organisations is critical to a shared, sustainable recovery and development process. This encompasses fundraising and partnerships as well as regular consultation and engagement with businesses, non-governmental organisations, and individuals in the community.



West End Ferry Terminal

Lead ministry: Ministry of Finance

Project: 091 Status: Planning

Start date: April 2019 Estimated end date: TBD

Outcome, Seaports: "Rehabilitated and expanded port facilities and services throughout the Territory with modernized and resilient facilities relevant to passengers and cargo"

Overview

The West End Ferry Terminal has been an important mode for travellers moving between the British Virgin Islands and the US Virgin Islands, as well as the sole hub for domestic travel between Jost Van Dyke and Tortola. This is a major access hub to the Virgin Islands with 170,000 passengers routing through this terminal in 2016. The destruction of the facility during hurricanes Irma and Maria has presented challenges to travellers wishing to travel to the BVI.

The West End Ferry Terminal project aims to revitalize the terminal and enhance it to be a major port hub within the Virgin Islands.

Status

The West End Ferry Terminal is still in the early planning phases. The Statement of Requirement was drafted and sent to the Premier's Office. The SoR was signed on 20 May and a presentation to the Premier provided feedback on the business case and design. A draft business case was submitted to the Premier's Office for feedback and comments.

Currently it is anticipated that a civil works package (for parking area land reclamation and shoreline stabilization works) could be commenced in December 2019. Demolition of existing foundations is planned for January 2020 with the terminal building foundation works, followed by building construction commencing in March 2020 and completed by March 2021.





Virgin Gorda Baths

Lead ministry: Natural Resources, Labour and Immigration

Project: 103 Status: Procurement

Start date: February 2019 Estimated end date: June 2019

Outcome 1: Improved tourism product that is aesthetically appealing, easily accessible and provides an enhanced experience to our visitors and a catalyst for economic recovery.

Overview

The Baths at Virgin Gorda is an important tourist destination that suffered damage to ticket booth, bathroom and bar shaded area. While originally the scope of works included minor repairs, the needs have since expanded to a wider project.

Activity 1: Design

Status: Completed Budget: \$1,500

The contractor, Systems Engineering, has submitted required designs for the beach and rest stop shades. As such, the design activity of this project has been completed.

Activity 2: Construction

Status: Procurement

After a Bill of Quantities (BOQ) was produced, one tender was received before the 8 May deadline. The RDA is currently working with this contractor to review the requirements, price, and timeline.



Removal of Derelict Boats

Lead ministry: Natural Resources, Labour and Immigration

Project: 133 Status: Procurement

Start date: October 2018 Estimated end date: November 2019

Outcome 1: Improved tourism product that is aesthetically appealing, easily accessible and provides an enhanced experience to our visitors and a catalyst for economic recovery

Overview

The passing of hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017 left a significant number of marine vessels stranded along the coastlines and bays of the Virgin Islands. The bulk of these vessels have been removed by the owners and their insurance providers. However approximately 280 derelict vessels remain that need to be removed from their land or sea location and then disposed of.

This is a large, complex project that requires detailed planning to minimize the effect on the environment and maintain value for money.

Activity 1: Staging Site Preparation

Status: Procurement

A bidder's conference was held on 3 May with 30 attendees. Single source procurement has been approved for staging site procurement and the lease for the staging site is being prepared.

Activity 2: Removal

Status: Procurement

Two bidder's conferences were held. One on 3 May with 30 attendees and a second on 17 May at the new staging site with 35 attendees. A Q&A is currently being drafted for contractors and the bidding process is closing on 24 June.

Activity 3: Processing



Sea Markers Installation

Lead ministry: Transportation, Works and Utilities

Project: 136 Status: Procurement

Start date: December 2018 Estimated end date: Sep 2019

Outcome N5: Immediate improvement to national infrastructure to prepare for recovery

Overview

The reinstatement of the navigational system is crucial to the navigation of BVI waters to ensure safe passage of vessels and ensure BVI is tourist ready. The Territory's sea markers are managed by the BVI Ports Authority (BVIPA), with input from Virgin Islands Shipping Registry (VISR) on placement.

The majority of the markers have been reinstated by BVIPA, however there are some markers still outstanding.

Status

A revised list of sea markers was sent to the tenderer to review and confirm unit prices. There is a possibility of an in-kind donation made to the project, which will require a change in requirement for the tenderer. The donor and tenderer will be meeting in June to work out specific technical details.



Temporary Classrooms at Elmore Stoutt High School

Lead ministry: Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries and Agriculture

Project: 147 Status: Procurement

Start date: November 2018 Estimated end date: September 2019

Outcome 2A: Restored educational and recreational facilities that provide a safe and secure environment for learning and recreational activities

Overview

The RDA is overseeing construction and renovation of temporary classrooms for Elmore Stoutt High School in consultation with the Ministry and landowners. The outcome of the project is to improve the present conditions at the school.

Activity 1: Temporary Classrooms

Status: Procurement

The Temporary Classrooms project has been split into two tasks: supply and installation. A revised scope of works and bill of quantities were created and an RFQ published. The process ended on 27 May with four suppliers returning bids. After evaluation of bids, the contract was awarded on 30 May to IESS St. Lucia Ltd..

Activity 2: CTL Improvements

Status: Procurement

An initial evaluation of the three tenders received only passed the technical evaluation. A request for clarification was sent to all three tenders, asking them to send 1) a work specific methodology inclusive of the sequence of activities, type of materials to be used and where a supplier/sub-contractor (if any) is required; and 2) a cost breakdown: an itemised cost breakdown detailing the price for the stated items of work. Responses were due on 29 May and the second evaluation is currently underway.







Virgin Gorda Sports Complex Repairs

Lead ministry: Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries and Agriculture

Project: 151 Status: Procurement

Start date: January 2019 Estimated end date: July 2019

Outcome 2A: Restored educational and recreational facilities that provide a safe and secure environment for learning and recreational activities

Overview

The Virgin Gorda basketball sports complex was damaged by the 2017 hurricanes and has been in a state of disrepair and thus unusable since then. The facility is used by the residents of Virgin Gorda for sporting events and recreation. The facility is currently unsuitable for use, denying the residents this opportunity.

Activity 1: Structure

Status: Procurement

The bidding process closed on 7 May. Technical and commercial evaluations were completed. There was a recommendation in favour of RFA Construction. The RDA is currently working with RFA construction on the specific requirements and cost of the structure.

Activity 2: Flooring

Status: Planning

A stakeholder meeting was held on 16 May. Following the meeting, the Recreational Trust is working with the RDA on proposed specifications of flooring before a call for tenders is released a second time following a failed first attempt.





AO Shirley Grounds Phase One

Lead ministry: Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries and Agriculture

Project: 152 Status: Operations

Start date: October 2018 Estimated end date: Feb 2020

Outcome 2A: Restored educational and recreational facilities that provide a safe and secure environment for learning and recreational activities

Overview

The AO Shirley athletics grounds is a priority project to renovate the grounds to meet international accreditation standards as a Level 2 ground, so that BVI can host upcoming national events later this year and future international events. This will require preparation of the grounds prior to the installation of the new track by the specialist company Mondo, repairs to make the perimeter secure to boost incomegeneration from events, installation of bathroom facilities, installation of lights to allow events after dark, repair to the spectator stand (ideally with shade), and renovation of the clubhouse pavilion to provide meetings, events and changing facilities.

Activity 1: Track

Status: Completed Budget: \$139,150

The track laying and painting has been completed, and the track activity is therefore finished. We have received feedback from BVIOC and athletes that they are happy with the quality of the track and how it was installed.





PHOTO 3: TRACK AFTER CONSTRUCTION 2



Activity 2: Bathroom

Status: Procurement

The contractor has been working with the RDA to ship the bathroom containers. The containers are scheduled to arrive on Tortola in June. The contractor will be there on site to receive the containers and ensure the containers are dropped in place, perfectly aligned, and sitting flat on the foundation.

Activity 3: Wall and Gates

Status: Operations

The contract to install the perimeter wall was finalised on 8 May and signed on 10 May. Exact locations of wall posts have been verified and the site has been turned over to the contractor. The works are expected to begin on 1 June.

Activity 4: Other Activities

Status: Planning

The design works for the grandstands have been completed and are currently being reviewed. After revisions there will be a confirmation of funding before proceeding. The stadium lighting is also awaiting confirmation of funding.

The bid for bathroom groundworks and drainage closed on 9 May. Three tenders were received and No Limit Construction was awarded the contract. The specific requirements, timeline, and cost have been revised between the RDA and the contractor and the contract is expected to be signed in the first week of June.

Virgin Gorda Admin Building Repair

Lead ministry: Governor's Group

Project: 160 Status: Operations

Start date: November 2018 Estimated end date: December 2019

Outcome 3C: Immediate improvement to priority government infrastructure and systems to improve services key to easing ability of doing business and prepare for recovery

Overview

The two Virgin Gorda Admin buildings, the Flax building and the Vanterpool building, were badly affected by the 2017 hurricanes. The roof of the Flax building was destroyed, and this building is now unoccupied.

All services are now being provided in the Vanterpool building. There are leaks (allowing ingress of rainwater) and traces of mould/damp in the Vanterpool building, which is contributing to the sub-standard provision of public services and health risks for staff.

Activity 1: Cleaning

Status: Completed Budget: \$12,780

Cleaning works, removal of ceiling tiles, and installation of aircon/dehumidifier have been completed. The ceiling tiles were inspected and confirmed as complete on 17 April. Further works have been identified to paint the floor in the Magistrate's Office to mitigate concrete dust.

Activity 2: Wooden Structures

Status: On Hold

The RDA is currently working with stakeholders on the requirements of the wooden structures and what the original occupants of the Vanterpool building need.

Activity 3: Repairs

Status: Planning

Design Report 1 for the repairs was received in mid-March. A stakeholder meeting was held on 28 March at the Deputy Governor's Office, confirming the requirements needed for the repairs. This meeting will inform the Design Report 2, which is needed to move forward into procurement.





Virgin Gorda Police Barracks Repair

Lead ministry: Governor's Group

Project: 182 Status: Operations Budget: \$902,902

Start date: September 2018 Estimated end date: June 2019

Outcome 3B: Functioning law enforcement institutions and communication networks to restore a sense of safety and security and improved communications between agencies

Overview

The purpose is to return the Virgin Gorda Police Barracks to a fully functional state with police able to deploy required numbers from Tortola. A key outcome will be for the police to be able to sleep personnel on Virgin Gorda to ensure a shift system can be effectively managed and to enable the pre-disposition of resources key to disaster preparedness ahead of the 2019 hurricane season.

Status

Construction is continuing to progress, although there have been reported minor delays due to electrical issues in the building. The final works in the building are being completed and the building is still expected to be completed in June.

All structural works on the building are expected to be completed on 24 June. Some items, such as the hurricane shutter windows are still being shipped, however, they will be installed once they arrive.





Jost Van Dyke Admin Building Repair

Lead ministry: Governor's Group

Project: 183 Status: Operations

Start date: July 2018 Estimated end date: June 2019

Outcome 3C: Immediate improvement to priority government infrastructure and systems to improve services key to easing ability of doing business and prepare for recovery

Overview

The repairs to the Jost Van Dyke administration building will re-establish a working space for the District Officer to coordinate public service delivery on the island, as well as space for police, customs and immigration services to become fully functional. This will re-establish a fully functioning border control point at the main jetty and re-establish a functional police base, including a cell. The full detailed scoping and procurement for this project have been completed and operations are ongoing.

Status

The building works are due to be completed on 14 June and building users have already moved into the top floor of the building. Final works are being completed, such as window installation and delivery of final pieces of furniture.






Overview

The hurricane disasters resulted in a significant amount of debris being deposited across the Virgin Islands and the project was developed to support the Department of Waste Management (DWM) to collect the debris. The objective of this project was to reduce the risk of damage and threat to human life, by removing debris which could become projectiles during strong winds ahead of the height of the 2018 hurricane season (early September).







Number of tons of debris removed from Tortola

Summary Report

This overall project was conceived in Summer 2018 as part of a much wider-ranging waste metal and derelict cars disposal programme of works in conjunction with the Department of Waste Management (DWM). The original programme of works was designed to aid in the removal of debris, scrap metal and derelict vehicles consolidated after the passage of hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017.

For the first part of the debris clearance in Tortola, 29 contractors submitted bids, with contracts awarded to 11 contractors to remove debris from 17 locations. By September 2018, the majority of work packages had been completed (16 of the 17 planned work packages). This included almost 500 lorry bins of debris collected from Tortola weighing approximately 1,200 tonnes which were taken to Pockwood Pond.

The final work package, which included debris from Virgin Gorda was delayed because the barge had not arrived during this time.

Numerous delays were caused by the failure to arrive in BVI by Met Global, who were contracted by DWM. Met Global owned the identified barge, car crusher, and car-stripping team.

Because Met-Global were not able to meet their obligations, neither the vehicles nor the waste metal was crushed, which led to a change in the Scope of Works.

Over the periods 5-7 and 12-14 April 2019, approximately 290 derelict cars and 920 cubic yards of scrap metal were removed from the Virgin Gorda North Sound dump and E. Flax storage yard. This debris was transported to Pockwood Pond by barge. Removal of debris from Virgin Gorda has marked the completion of this project, and the Department of Waste Management is expected to complete removal of any remaining derelict cars and debris on Virgin Gorda.


