			A contract for asphalting works on the six completed sites was signed with Tortola Paving Ltd. on 23 July 2021. By November 2021, asphalt paving was completed at all six sites, namely Great Mountain I and II, Ballast Bay, Little Dix Hill, Hope to Sabbath Hill and Bob's Gas Station sites.
			The designed sequencing of road works has facilitated maintenance of traffic flow into and out of Road Town, in compliance with Traffic Management Plans designed for this project.
			At the Great Mountain 1 site, all remaining work was completed in January 2021, with guardrails painted and plants installed in the exposed soil area. This activity has been completed, and a closeout report is being prepared.

			At the Great Mountain 2 site, a new culvert has been completed following construction and backfill of the structure, and the road surface has been refurbished and guardrails installed. In June, work was completed on the approved variation to improve road safety.
			In May 2021, the Hope to Sabbath Hill activity was completed, with drains and guardrails completed and work finalised on raising drains to facilitate a smooth surface once asphaltic works are done.
			At the Ballast Bay/Windy Hill site, in June 2021 the final road surface and drainage works were completed, and the road was fully opened to traffic.
			The Bob's Gas Station site reached practical completion in May 2021 following completion of work on the drainage system.
			The Little Dix Hill site also reached practical completion in May 2021, following installation of guardrails and completion of road curbs.

In October

2021, the electrical inspection was conducted. Due to material shipping delays, including in receipt of windows and doors, this project is now scheduled to be completed in December 2021.
A combined Opening Ceremony for the Flax and Vanterpool Buildings will be scheduled following completion of the Vanterpool Building.

## 4. Stakeholder Engagement and Grievance Redress

Projects being implemented by the RDA impact a multitude of communities and other stakeholders throughout the BVI. Stakeholder engagement is therefore an integral part of the project cycle at every stage. The RDA has dedicated resources to facilitate the participation of communities, Government, the private sector and other stakeholders in the planning, design, implementation and monitoring phases of infrastructure projects it manages.

A total of 49 persons participated in ten (10) meetings during November 2021. The following diagram summarises the main stakeholder engagement activities by project for the month of November 2021.



#### **GRIEVANCE REDRESS SYSTEM**

The RDA's Grievance Redress System (GRS) was officially launched on 31st March 2021 via a press release on the RDA's website¹ with the article also being circulated on the Government of the Virgin Islands website² and picked up by the local media via their online publications³. As part of the public sensitisation material a video⁴ was developed and released on the RDA's social media site explaining the GRS process including: how to lodge a complaint and an appeal, the purpose and importance of the GRS, what information is required and how the internal decision-making process works. The GRS Handbook has also been developed as a tool to sensitize the public about the system. It summarises important information about the GRS and is available on the RDA's website⁵.

In November, no new grievances were lodged and all decisions were disseminated in October. To date no appeals on decisions made have been received by the RDA.

## 5. Funding

The overall recovery and development programme of the RDA is funded by a combination of grants from the Government of the Virgin Islands (GoVI), the UK Government (UKG), and private funders.

The following section details contracted public funding and private grants to RDA projects to date, funding the specific initiatives listed.

**Public funding** is defined as funds that are granted from government or other public institutions including statutory bodies and state-owned enterprises.

**Private funding** is defined as funds raised from businesses, private individuals or non-governmental organisations.

The table listed below shows contracted funds. Contracted funding refers to contributions which have been fully contracted and signed by the funder. This list includes general funding for the Phase One Programme from the Government of the Virgin Islands as well as loan funding to GoVI for implementation of the Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Loan (RRL) from the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB).

## 6. Project Updates – Phase One and RDP Programmes

## Anegada Recreation Facilities

Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries & Agriculture

Project: 143.01 Status: Delivery

Start Date: July 2020 End Date: TBD

**Cost Estimate**: \$160,000 **Spend to Date**: \$163,139

Outcome: "Redeveloped community recreational facilities supporting community and school

recreation and national pride in sports."

#### Overview

The Anegada Recreation Facilities project has aimed to rehabilitate the Anegada Recreation Grounds. The first activity under this project involved rubberised resurfacing of the basketball court in the facility, and the second activity has involved reconstruction of the facility's perimeter fencing.

This project also envisions overall facility rehabilitation including construction of a club house, lighting, toilet facility, bleacher seating and playground equipment. Additional funding has been sought for implementation of the remaining activities within this project.

## **Activity 1: Rubberised Resurfacing of the Basketball Court**

## **Status: Completed**

The basketball court surfacing activity has been completed, with the court demarcating and backboards and hoops installed in April 2021. This work marked completion of the rubberised resurfacing activity of this project.

## **Activity 2: Fencing**

#### **Status: Delivery**

In November 2021, work on the perimeter fencing reached practical completion which has included installation of required concrete beams, a new picket fence, metal chain link fencing, and double metal vehicular and pedestrian gates.

Procurement and installation of playground equipment at the site will also form part of this project.

#### Overview

The Virgin Gorda basketball sports complex was damaged by the 2017 hurricanes and had been unusable and in a state of disrepair due to this damage. The facility is used by the residents of Virgin Gorda for sporting events and recreation. While unusable, the state of the facility had been denying residents opportunity for use. The scope of this project was expanded to include a car park, outdoor court, bathrooms, and drainage improvements. Due to this scope expansion, the estimated cost of the project increased significantly.

## **Activity 1: Phase One, Structure and Flooring**

### **Status: Completed**

In June 2021, installation of the indoor sport floor tiles was completed, with scoreboard and wall panels also installed. Guttering and downspouts for the main building were also installed in June. This marked practical completion of Phase 1 of this project.

### Activity 2: Phase Two, Bathrooms, Outdoor Court, Car Park

## **Status: Delivery**

Works on the restroom facilities under phase 2 of this project were completed in November 2020, and work on the rubberised outdoor court surface reached practical completion in May 2021.

With other works reaching practical completion, additional work to complete this project includes work on the car park. Tender documents for work on the car park have been compiled and a bidder's conference was held in October with bids due in November 2021. The project is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2021.


#### Overview

The AO Shirley athletics and sports grounds project has been a priority project to renovate the grounds to meet international accreditation standards as an IAAF Class 2 ground, so that the Territory can host national and international events. The required rehabilitation of the grounds has included installation of the new track, repairs to make the perimeter secure to boost income-generation from events, installation of bathroom facilities, installation of lights to allow events after dark, repair to the spectator stand, and renovation of the clubhouse pavilion to provide meetings, events and changing facilities.

## **Activity 1: Track**

## Status: Completed

The track laying and painting have been completed, and the track activity is therefore finished. We have received feedback from BVIOC and athletes that they are happy with the quality of the track and how it was installed.





## **Activity 2: Bathroom**

## Status: Completed

The bathroom installation has been completed as of late August 2019 when final adjustments were finished.



**Activity 3: Wall and Gates** 

## **Status: Completed**

This activity has been completed, with all panels installed and site debris cleared on 27 November 2019. The activity was handed over to the Ministry on 5 December 2019.





**Activity 4: Trackside Fence** 

## **Status: Completed**

Contract was signed with No Limit Construction on 6 September. Works began and were completed in September – with completion on 30 September 2019. The trackside fence was signed over to the Ministry on 4 October 2019.

## **Activity 5: Lighting**

## Status: Delivery

In early 2021, a structural review of the lighting pole base design was conducted to prevent upliftment due to the high underground water table. In November 2021 geotechnical investigations were completed. The report on these investigations is currently being prepared, following which the light stanchion foundations will be designed. Given delays due to soil concerns, the lighting activity for the Grounds is now expected to be completed by the end of the second quarter of 2022.





**Activity 6: Grandstand** 

### **Status: Completed**

The grandstand seating, roof, handrails, and staircases have all been installed, and this activity has thus reached substantial completion. The grandstand has been opened and is now in use.



## **Activity 7: Pavilion**

## Status: Planning

The scope of works for the pavilion is currently being revised to include additional requirements specified by the Ministry.

#### Overview

The Repair of the Marine Base aims at returning the facilities to functional condition following significant damage from 2017's storms. This project involves several activities including installation of fencing and gates, boat rack, and repairs to the main building and dock facilities. These repairs will support a joint Customs and Marine Police security capability.

## **Status: Delivery**

The fencing, gates and drains activity for the Marine Base reached practical completion in July 2021, with final works for the motorised gates and installation of drainage grills and security spikes completed.

The contract for the provision of mechanical and electrical design services for the main building was awarded in May 2021. Detailed designs including technical specifications and MEPFS drawings are being prepared and are scheduled to be submitted to TCP by the end of the year. Preparation of tender documents for the reconstruction and retrofitting of the building are ongoing.





## **Waste Management Solutions**

# Ministry of Health and Social Development

**Outcome**: "Improved facilities for processing waste on Tortola and Virgin Gorda to enable the environmentally sound processing of waste that protects the health of people and protects the environment."

#### Overview

The Government of the Virgin Islands has identified solid waste disposal as a priority issue and requires assistance to create a sanitary landfill and waste site rehabilitation, and to establish auxiliary services and a feasibility study, and make recommendations to ensure an evidence-based decision is made prior to the detailed design phase.

The objectives of this project are designed to shape a programme that will allow for the development of a sustainable and modern sanitary landfill that contributes to responsible, circular management of waste within the BVI. This will be done through the following:

- Investigation of available options for the BVI to manage its waste responsibly;
- Development of options into detailed designs;
- Procurement of construction services that will deliver the desired outcome within budget; and
- The management of delivery of the plan to ensure that the project is delivered on time, within cost, and to the specified quality.

The outputs from this technical assistance will provide the recommendations needed to develop the most responsible and cost-effective means to dispose of landfilled waste in the Territory for the next twenty (20) years. This work will allow for the design and ultimate contracting of a modern means for managing waste that will form part of a cohesive Waste Management Strategy.

## **Status: Delivery**

A contract was awarded and signed with Wood Group to conduct a feasibility assessment and concept design for a sanitary landfill establishment, as well as existing waste site rehabilitation and establishment of an auxiliary service station. In November 2021, the consultant team visited the Territory for on-site consultations and planning. The final inception report which included feedback from this site visit was submitted at the end of November.

# Renewable Energy Installations

## MECYFA/MHSD

Project: 192 Status: Delivery

Outcome: "A more resilient energy system with lower electricity costs from the deployment of

modern renewable energy technology, which combined with best-practice resource

management, can deliver a stronger, smarter, greener, better Virgin Islands."

## Overview

The Territory's transmission and distribution network was severely damaged by passage of the 2017 storms. The time it took to restore power to key communities around the Territory highlighted the vulnerability of the electrical network. In conjunction with other efforts, this project aims to provide increased community resilience, in terms of electricity provision.

The RDA has secured funding from the FCDO through the Governor's Office to support the creation of community solar hubs. These will provide community access to electricity during periods of extended outage. The systems will provide solar energy to two Primary Schools (Ivan Dawson and Leonora Delville) as well as the Jost Van Dyke Clinic. These systems will offset components of these buildings' energy consumption bill and provide an opportunity for the benefits of renewable energy to be displayed to future generations and the larger community.

## **Status: Delivery**

Following contract signature for installation of solar facilities at Leonora Delville and Ivan Dawson Primary Schools as well as the Jost van Dyke clinic, the following works have taken place:

In June 2021, all required approvals from BVIEC and TCP were received for the grid-tie system installed at the Leonora Delville Primary School.

The BVIEC and TCP approval processes for the Ivan Dawson school interconnections following installation of the solar system have now been completed, with required site inspections by the Building Authority and BVIEC completed in September 2021.

Installation of the photovoltaic system at the Jost Van Dyke Clinic was completed in September 2021. Required inspections by TCP and BVIEC were completed in October 2021, facilitating full approval of this activity.





## AG's Residence/ Estate House #1

## Deputy Governor's Office

Project: 193 Status: Delivery

Start Date: April 2020 End Date: December 2021

**Outcome**: "Provision of safety, security and rights of our people and strengthened borders

through law enforcement capability, resources and engagement."

#### Overview

The Government-owned residences of the Attorney General (AG) and the Judges in McNamara have been identified as priorities for repair in part because of the high cost of alternate accommodations as well as the opportunity costs of not having the buildings utilised. The AG's and Judges' residences were all rendered uninhabitable by passage of the 2017 hurricanes. The level of repair needed ranges from interior renovation and remodelling to repair and replacement of both structural as well as non-structural elements.

Repair to the AG's residence/Estate House #1 will allow for the Attorney General to be accommodated in safe, secure facilities within the Road Town area. Repairs to the residences are expected to yield significant savings in rent. The improvements are also expected to reduce operating costs of the homes.

## **Status: Delivery**

Work completed to November 2021 has included internal and external roof works, electrical and plumbing works, external and internal painting, interior tiling, and work on the bathroom. This project will include full replacement of roof and structural elements, windows, doors, drywall, new kitchen cabinetry, closets, electrical, plumbing, air conditioning and exterior works. This work is now expected to be completed by December 2021 due to delays in receipt of materials. Further planning and construction of the three Judges' residences awaits confirmed funding.





## 7. Project Updates – CDB Programme

### Overview

This project is focused on the first phase of redevelopment of the territories' legal infrastructure, by constructing a magistrate's court on the old Eslyn Henley site in Tortola. It aims to complete the process of ensuring continuity of the judicial process, by relocating the magistrate's court occupants from their temporary facility.

## **Status: Planning**

In May 2021, the redesign of the building was completed and submitted to the Deputy Governor's Office based on decisions on the scale and scope of the project by the Deputy Governor and the Premier. The submitted redesign has been reviewed, and confirmation of funding to construct the redesigned building is awaited.



## Eslyn Henley Richez Learning Centre

Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth Affairs, Fisheries & Agriculture

Project: 083 Status: Planning Start Date: September 2019 End Date: TBD

**Spend to Date:** \$107,807

**Outcome**: "Improved climate resilient and socially-inclusive infrastructure and institutions in the transport, water and sewerage, governance, education and national security sectors in the Virgin Islands."

#### Overview

This project aims to construct a new facility for the Eslyn Henley Richez Learning Centre, which is a Special Educational Needs facility, taking a holistic approach to the reconstruction. The envisioned facility will serve up to thirty students, and will be fully accessible, accommodating the needs of students who are severely autistic, mentally as well as physically challenged, and have a variety of learning disabilities.

## **Status: Planning**

The detailed design for the school has been submitted to Town and Country Planning for approval. Progression of this project into procurement is now expected within the first quarter of 2022. Documentation to procurement was submitted in early November 2021. Following review and amendment, this project is expected to proceed to procurement in early 2022.

#### Overview

The West End Ferry Terminal has been an important mode for travellers moving between the British Virgin Islands and the US Virgin Islands, as well as the sole hub for domestic travel between Jost Van Dyke and Tortola. This is a major access hub to the Virgin Islands with 170,000 passengers routing through this terminal in 2016. The destruction of the facility during hurricanes Irma and Maria has presented challenges to travellers wishing to travel to the BVI.

The West End Ferry Terminal project aims to revitalize the terminal and enhance it to be a major port hub within the Virgin Islands.

## **Status: Planning**

A contract was signed with INROS Lackner SE in August 2021 for overall design and project management for this project, following receipt of CDB's No Objection. Stakeholder consultations as well as a broad community meeting for sensitisation were held in August to assist in mobilisation of the consultant. The inception report was completed in September 2021 and finalised in November 2021. A ground investigation survey has been requested as an input to the Environmental Scoping Report, expected to be completed within the coming weeks. The preliminary design is now expected to be completed by the end of December 2021.

## Reservoirs and Metering

# Ministry of Transportation, Works & Utilities

Project: 140 Status: Delivery

Start Date: October 2019 End Date: December 2021

**Outcome**: "Improved climate resilient and socially-inclusive infrastructure and institutions in the transport, water and sewerage, governance, education and national security sectors in the Virgin Islands."

#### Overview

Hurricanes Maria and Irma caused damage to the water and sewerage system estimated at around \$63,000,000. There was severe damage to the water network and major storage reservoirs were impacted to various extents. From minor impacts to completely destroyed assets, the two hurricanes left water and sewerage infrastructure that was severely compromised. The average level of unaccounted for water after the hurricanes stood at over 50%, evidencing significant losses.

Most of the water distribution network was impacted by the hurricanes, leading to water leaks in the water supply network. The customer metering coverage is partially restored, with the rest of the customers being on assessed consumption. The Government has taken a holistic approach to the rehabilitation and reconstruction of the damaged infrastructure.

### **Status: Delivery**


Carrot Bay site: On 15 June 2021, this reservoir activity was handed over, following filling and testing of the tanks in May. Final works have been completed on the tanks, valves, fencing and lights.

Long Bush site: Work on water supply connections to the tank was completed in June, and this reservoir activity was handed over on 18 June 2021.

Zion Hill site: With completion of work on the Carrot Bay Reservoir, on-site works on this activity began on 29 June 2021. In November 2021, this activity reached practical completion, with work completed including demolition of the existing structure, framework and concrete casting of the blinding, tank footing and anchors, construction of the tank, and installation of pipe connections and meters. A Handover ceremony was held in November 2021.

Completion of this activity and installation of all meters brings the overall Reservoirs project to a close.







# Roads, Slopes, and Coastal Defences

**Outcome**: "Improved climate resilient and socially-inclusive infrastructure and institutions in the transport, water and sewerage, governance, education and national security sectors in the Virgin Islands."

#### Overview

Project: 180

The intended goal of this project is to repair, rehabilitate and reconstruct the priority roads in the Territory. There was severe damage to the road network on the western and north-western portion of Tortola. Sea defences in different areas were destroyed and will require replacement and upgrading. Other roads suffered significant damage down to the sub-grade beneath the concrete layer, while in other areas rehabilitation works include road/slope/embankment stabilization.

### **Current Status**

Work has now been completed on all six of the first sites, namely the Great Mountain 1, Great Mountain 2, Hope to Sabbath Hill, Little Dix Hill, Ballast Bay and Bob's Gas Station sites.

In August 2021, a contract was signed with Autland Heavy Equipment for road and slope stabilisation works in *Long Trench* and works began in early September. In October 2021 all retaining walls were completed and expansion joints were installed in preparation for backfilling.

On 24 September 2021, a contract was signed with Autland Heavy Equipment for work on the *Fish Bay* site. In October 2021, several meetings were held with business owners to update them on the project schedule and progress. Works are scheduled to begin in early November 2021 with construction of the bypass road.

A contract for *asphalting works* on the six completed sites was signed with Tortola Paving Ltd. on 23 July 2021. In October 2021, asphalt paving was completed at all six sites.

The designed sequencing of road works has facilitated maintenance of traffic flow into and out of Road Town, in compliance with Traffic Management Plans designed for this project.

At the *Great Mountain 1* site, all remaining work was completed in January, with guardrails painted and plants installed in the exposed soil area. This activity has been completed, and a closeout report is being prepared.

At the *Great Mountain 2* site, a new culvert has been completed following construction and backfill of the structure, and the road surface has been refurbished and guardrails installed. In June, work was completed on the approved variation to improve road safety.

In May, the *Hope to Sabbath Hill* activity was completed, with drains and guardrails completed and work finalised on raising drains to facilitate a smooth surface once asphaltic works are done.

At the *Ballast Bay/Windy Hill* site, in June the final road surface and drainage works were completed, and the road was fully opened to traffic.

The *Bob's Gas Station* site reached practical completion on 5 May following completion of work on the drainage system.

The *Little Dix Hill* site also reached practical completion in May, following installation of guardrails and completion of road curbs.

## Overview

There are three Government Buildings in Virgin Gorda that will be completely refurbished under the Caribbean Development Bank's Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Loan. The approximately \$3 million project will include rehabilitation of the Vanterpool, Flax and North Sound building complexes. The objective of this project is to restore the functionality of the administrative heart of Virgin Gorda, while adding resiliency and functionality to the spaces.

## North Sound Building

The North Sound activity has been completed and handed over to the DG's Office. The Opening Ceremony for the renamed John George Sr. Building was held on 9 February 2021.

## Flax Building

In March 2021, practical completion was achieved on the Flax building, with windows and doors installed, tiling work completed, and the ceiling, other effects and finishing works completed. The building was handed over to the Deputy Governor's Office in March for them to furnish and bring it into full utility.

## Vanterpool Building

Works completed thus far on the Vanterpool building have included external roof and internal ceiling repairs, installation of electrical, air conditioning and wastewater treatment equipment, and installation of windows and doors, as well as commenced installation of storm shutters. Due to material shipping delays, this project is now scheduled to be completed before the end of 2021.

A combined Opening Ceremony for the Flax and Vanterpool Buildings will be scheduled following completion of the Vanterpool Building.

# Bregado Flax Educational Centre

## **Summary Report**

Rehabilitation of existing Blocks 2-4 and the Administration Block of the Bregado Flax Educational Centre was funded through the CDB Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Loan (RRL). This project aimed not only at rehabilitating the existing hurricane-damaged buildings, but also adding resilience through the installation of a concrete roof.

The school project began in April 2019 and reached practical completion in May 2021. Work completed included installation of concrete roof, electrical and plumbing works, installation of windows, doors and air conditioning system, and retrofitting of bathrooms. The completed project was handed over on 26 May 2021 and the opening ceremony will be held in the coming weeks.

This project was able to deliver on its planned output of rehabilitating a school to better meet teachers and students' needs. This has effectively increased the number of classrooms available to students of Bregado Flax and has improved school settings for approximately 440 students who attend the school.





# Anegada Admin Complex and Police Station

## **Summary Report**

The Repair of Anegada Admin Complex and Police Station project returned the police station and administration building in Anegada to functional condition following extensive damage wreaked by 2017's storms to both external and internal infrastructural elements of the building.

Works on the Anegada Admin Building began in March 2021 and were completed in July 2021. These works included roof repairs, plumbing and electrical works, tiling, internal and external painting and work on landscaping and the parking area. This project was able to produce its expected outputs and has provided an appropriate space from which administrative services can be provided in Anegada.
